Drug Take Back

On April 24th, 2021, South Mountain W.O.R.K.S.
Coalition partnered with AZ State Bikes, the Phoenix
Police Department, the Arizona National Guard, and
Walgreens for the first 2021 DEA National Drug Take
Back Event at two separate Walgreens locations in
South Phoenix. Altogether in the city of Phoenix we
collected about 900 pounds of prescription medication.
Putting our local year to date collection at over 600
pounds of prescription medication that our youth won't
be able to experiment with.

Supporting this year was new coalition partners, AZ State Bikes, whose mission is to build low-rider bikes with youth as a way to help keep them safe and productive. Oscar Gonzalez, founder of AZ State Bikes, not only brought out the low-rider bikes (as well as cars) but also the grill to share food with community folks who stopped by. This was our first, of hopefully many, partnered events with AZ State Bikes.

The event was highly successful with Phoenix Police taking the medicine to be destroyed and the National Guard distributing Naloxone nasal spray (an overdose reversal medication). The SMWORKS coalition volunteers provided resources to families and engaged the local un-housed population with resources and food as well. The next drug take back will be in April and reoccurring quarterly.
